Your Committee News

The Main Points Arising from the Annual General Meeting (Held 18th April 2000)

JUMP HEIGHTS

The maximum jump height was reduced to 14 inches, this was changed purely on the grounds of dog safety.

The minimum height remains at 8 inches.

BREAK OUTS

The 'Break Out Rule' was amended, it will only cover those Teams entering a submitted time. It will not apply to seeded Teams.

Other rules were changed, mainly administration, tightening to avoid a re-occurrence of the problems affecting our sport last year. A full copy of the new BFA Rules and policies are available through your Team Captain, Regional Representatives or the BFA website. Rule changes are now being issued with a start date from which the rule(s) become valid.

MEMBERSHIP

The BFA will move to a single renewal date next year, 1st April 2001. Current members will be given a grace period of one month to re-join, after which they will incur a re-joining fee of £2.50. New members will be charged a joining fee of £2.50. Memberships for all new or re-joining members will be charged pro rata after 1st April 2000.

TEAMS

There will be, from 1st April 2001, an ACTIVE TEAM LIST. This is to aid Show Organisers and only those teams who pay £1.00 to remain on the BFA Active Team List will receive Show Schedules. At present Show Organisers have to send a schedule to all BFA registered teams, many are not active and would not go to the show anyway. The Active Team List will reduce time, effort and overheads considerably. The Fee should be paid with membership renewals.

It will now cost £10.00 to register a Primary Team and four Secondary Teams.

The BFA is to start a database of Teams willing to take new members, any team wishing to be included should write to the PO Box. If included, enquiries in their area will be forwarded to them.

There is to be a re-appraisal of the points allocation system, we would like to hear from anyone with views on this subject. Ideas to the BFA Secretary please.

BFA MEMBERS AWARDS

All Awards are based on the collection of Flyball Points gained in the year, with the exception of the BFA Special Team Award (based on shows hosted, attended etc). Whilst all these prestigious awards are well earned, the BFA also needs to recognise the elite dogs in our sport as well.

Some of the best dogs are not seen at every show throughout the year, this could be due to financial or work constraints of their owners, thus eliminating them from being able to gain any award offered by the BFA. The Committee will this year introduce a new Members Award, and Most Improved Team Award.

The following criteria will be used for the Members Award:-

All Regional Representatives, BFA Head Judges and Officers will be asked to nominate three dogs they believe to be the finest Flyball dogs competing in our sport that year. The results will then be collated and the six most nominated dogs will go forward onto a list for the BFA Members Award. The nominations will then be sent to all Team Captains/Managers who, hopefully with input from Team Members, will list the nominated dogs in order of preference. The nominated dogs handlers/owners will be invited to attend the AGM where one of the nominations will be presented with the award.

The Most Improved Team of the Year will run in the same way.

NEW POINTS AWARD

There will also be a new Award for attaining 3,000 points, for those dogs who find it a long way from 1,000 to 5,000 points. This will be called the Graduate Award. It will be backdated to those requesting it, and automatic for those yet to attain it.

HEAD JUDGES

Andy Bawden is to head a panel to look into a procedure to grant Head Judge status. He wishes to hear from anyone with comments on this subject.

FOREIGN VISITORS

A Primary Team has been created to allow visiting teams to compete at BFA Sanctioned Tournaments.

Any team from overseas will be named as a secondary team and have the right to win, but will not be awarded points.

BFA PROPERTY

Does anyone have any knowledge of the whereabouts of any BFA property? Our Asset Register is incomplete, we know there are items out there, e.g. some Flag Poles. If you could offer any information it would be appreciated.

NEW STARTER PACKS

We are looking into creating new Starter Packs to advertise BFA to new Members/Teams etc. We want to make a video about the BFA, to show the equipment used and training methods. Are there any members with video footage to offer? All donations gratefully received.

BFA SUMMER CHAMPIONSHIP

The BFA Summer Championship 2000 is different this year. It will run over three events, Daventry, Congleton and Althorne. The following format will be used to establish the final placings:

Points will be awarded as if all the teams are in one big division, e.g. If there are 6 teams in Division 1 their points would be (1st) place 100 points, (2nd) 98, (3rd) 96 (4th) 94 (5th) 92 (6th) 90 and (1st) place in Division 2 would get 88 points (2nd) 86 and so on throughout the Divisions. It means it does not matter if you are in a different division at the next Championship.

Only the best two results will be taken, so if you miss one of the events it will not matter.

After the final event Teams will then be divided into five divisions of equal numbers or as equal as can be e.g. 33 teams - 5 Divisions of 6, 6, 7, 7, 7.

The BFA Summer Championship Trophy and Seven Medals will be awarded on the day of the last event. BFA Divisional Shields and Seven Medals will be awarded to each divisional winners on the day of the last event.

Tie Breakers: 1. Fastest time of any three Tournaments.

- 2. Head to head over the three events.
- 3. Head to head run off, if both Teams present.
- 4. Coin toss.

COMMITTEE CHANGES

The committee wish to thank the membership for their support last year and at the AGM, the Committee Members remain the same as last year except for Betty Potts from the Yorkshire Bouncers and Graham Nye who has been co-opted on as Acting Secretary. We welcome them both.

THE LONLINESS OF A BOX LOADER

(A follow up on from the last issues 'Lonely Box Loader at Training')

Have you ever noticed, the only time a Box Loader is remembered is when they forgot to - (a) **Load the Box**

(b) Put the Ball in the wrong hole

The racing has stopped, there's a problem at the other end (where the team is), the Box Loader doesn't know why, and they certainly can't hear anything. Never mind, the racing is about to restart. The Judge is looking at you to see if you are ready, the race is started - hang on - the dogs are coming down in a different order!

Now, if you think and react quickly and know intimately which way each and every dog in the team turns, you have a chance of loading the Box correctly. It doesn't do your nerves any good, but you cope. The real problem occurs when you are loading for a team of dogs you are not familiar with. All goes well to begin with, the team have signalled the way you should load the balls and then.... out of the blue the team run their reserve dog (without informing the Box Loader) and 9 times out of 10 that dog would prefer the ball in the other hole.

Whoever came up with the two and three hole box has a lot to answer for, it was much easier with the one - holer it kept the blood pressure down.

Box Loaders are a breed apart. Many don't get the chance to run a dog and take great pride in the part they play, they have to concentrate and work efficiently with the team. They also have to be patient, very broad shouldered and philosophical when they get yelled at by that very same team.

If you've never been a Box Loader at a Show, perhaps you should try it, then you would understand the above sentiments exactly.


I make every effort to keep our dogs cool and keep their water topped up

The Finale was superb with the Massed Bands and Choirs, even if the dry ice was a bit thick. The Team emerged through the fog for the community singing and Sunset.
