



EVISED RULES & POLICIES POST 2002 AGM

evised copies of pages 14 & 19 had been issued on 24th May, the revisions to be operative from 17th June.

NNUAL AWARDS

was agreed that a new Non-Specific Breed Award would be introduced for 1st, 2nd & 3rd dogs (not covered by the five Breed Specific wards) who individually gained the most Flyball points from 1st January – 31st December.

he Committee agreed that the poor and inadequate completion of Time Sheets by some Te ams which, with the larked increase in the number of Tournaments this year, placed an unacceptable additional burden on the alleady heavy workload on our Records & Statistics Co-ordinator. The Secretary would write to all Team Callins advising them that it is their responsibility to ensure that their Team's Time Sheets are fully and accurately completed. Failure to do so would result in their Team's Flyball points being withheld for the Tournal ent in question.

In order to give all dogs racing that safety marging would mean we would have to change the rule about 4" lower than the shoulder height of the dog to 6".

CRACKER


I'm writing Cracker's entry in the magazine this time – she's taking time out. What an up and down journey a dog's life is and how an event or incident can put everything into perspective!

When racing had finished for the day and they were handing out the awards we were all thrilled to find we were Fourth and we all received a lovely green rosette. We think we all did really well for a first tournament and Aunty Jean said she was very proud of us. *Well done PODextras*.

It was a wonderful day and when we eventually got home I just climbed onto my Mums lap and slept all evening. I don't think she was impressed as I am a bit big for that. We are all really looking forward to our next tournament and I shall try to remember to pack my own harness in case Mum forgets.

my amazine amy

"I'd like the boldest bitch, but one with not too much white on the face". Five days later Amy arrived from Scotland in a cat basket. She was a rescue puppy, younger than I expected with very bandy back legs. I wondered what I had let myself in for! A strong compact very enthusiastic dog developed.

Amy went to Cranbourne Dog Training School where she progressed quickly and gained the ultimate, her Gold Medal. At Obedience Shows she did well but was easily distracted by prams and young children, always on the look-out for my son Shaun.

However, one cold, damp morning in January 1997 she discovered Flyball. After that initial embarrassing tournament at Luton, when, as a first time handler, my dog decided that the ball in the other lane was much better, she progressed well. A minor blip occurred when she changed the rules and decided she needed to go down the lane twice. This was corrected and she became a Barkshire Bandit. Now running in the first team she continued to collect rosettes and BFA certificates.

August 1998 saw her taking maternity leave (much to her disgust)! From her large litter of ten puppies I kept Taylor and Tyson. Spring 1999 and Amy was back in her role as a career woman. The first Bandit dog to gain her Silver Award.

Tyson learned the basics of Flyball in an afternoon but teaching him a technique whereby he would see his next birthday was to take a little longer. He had no concept about slowing down before slamming into the box or that the dog running down next should not be annihilated. After an apprenticeship with the bullets he joined his mother in the First Team.

June 2001 was time for a celebration, Amy achieved her Gold Award for 15000 flyball points. By October Tyson also had his Silver.

Taylor was also following in the family footsteps. As a young dog he was destined for the obedience ring but he didn't see the point. At flyball training he was a danger to himself and everyone else. I had to teach him at home. He now runs for the Bandits but only a few runs as he wears himself out waiting to go. After this he can be found in the nearest source of water. He is now a Flyball Dog Advanced.

When Taylor became a Bandit, Amy was pushed out but Tyson was without a handler. He got passed around a bit but our captain, Penny, took on the job. With her expert eye she made him an anchor dog to be reckoned with. His title of 'Dog of the Year 2001' is all down to Penny. Thank You.

Early this year Amy had an accident which resulted in severe damage to her lower back and hamstrings. A hasty trip to the Wellback Clinic, in the New Forest, started her road to recovery. She was miserable and had to be crate rested for weeks. I was convinced she would have to retire but Amy had other ideas. Several more treatments from our Chiropractor ensured that at the age of six she was having a second puppyhood.

As noisy and mad as ever she's a reliable member of the bullets. It's sometimes easy to take her for granted but she is very useful for training new dogs and handlers because she knows her job. This makes her feel important.

It was a great shock when in May this year we were again up at the front during the prize giving. Andy gave Amy a lovely introduction before presenting her with the 'Ice Blue Moon Award' for 20,000 points. I was on a high for weeks! Andy's famous dog Blue, had the award named after him as he was the first dog to go this far in flyball. Mo's dog Tweed, who is a cleverdog expert as well, also achieved this. Amy is the third dog to join a very elite group. I'm so proud of her.

She is the dog who got me into flyball. We've had a lot of help from many teams over the past five years so a big Thank You goes out to everyone, especially the Barkshire Bandits who helped to make her 'My Amazing Amy'.
