A Sad Farewell to the Legendary Ice Blue Moon (0014B)

Blue (aged sixteen and a half) has sadly passed away and is now playing in those green, green fields (no doubt showing how flyball is done!)

Blue started his flyball career in May 1994, gaining his Flyball Dog award at that first tournament. By 1997 he was Flyball dog of the year with 4,823 points and runner up to his team-mate Ellie in the Border Collie (as it was then) category. In 1998, he was again Flyball Dog of the Year, this time with 6,748 points, and was also Border Collie of the year. He was in the Top UK team in 1997 and 1998 and also the top European dog in 1998.

At the last Committee meeting of 1998 the Committee were 'asked to think about an award for the dog reaching 20,000 points *our ultimate award.*' A decision was reached that the award should be named after the first dog to reach 20,000 points. At this time Blue was close to achieving this milestone and the committee agreed to consult Liz Payne – Andrew's wife. At the January 1999 meeting it was reported that Liz had suggested some form of crystal relating to Blue's full name. He reached his 20,000 points on 20th February 1999 and was presented with the very first Ice Blue Moon award (Ice Blue Moon being Blue's KC name) at the AGM in April.

At **thirteen** years of age he retired from racing having gained his Jade award. He had been 'top dog' for ten years, having been the first dog to gain virtually every points award up to the Jade.

Gone but not forgotten until we meet again.

Leapt from the end – made a hellava splash!


Grabbed the ball and swam to the shore.

Your Committee News

A few points arising from the Committee Meeting held on 28th October 2007

Update on lights. By the end of the year the revenue from hiring out the lights should be £4,100.

The sensors on the gates of the Millstream may be changed as a remedy to the problems that have been occurring. A new set of lights will be needed at some stage but more research into other lights is needed before a decision is made. Steve is investigating the repairs needed for the Watch-Dog set. Anne will be asking show organisers, over the winter, if they mind using her new set as long as there's a back up set available in case of problems.

Measuring Hoops It was agreed that the new measuring hoop would be used next year (2008) with all the old hoops being made obsolete. All measuring boards (which tournament organisers supply) should be 4ft x 3ft.

Annual Awards It has been decided that the only annual awards will be a) Team of the Year, awarded to the team that runs the fastest time in the year. This award will go from 1st to 3rd place. b) Multi-breed Team of the Year, first place only, awarded to the fastest multi-breed team. c) The Claire Gristwood and Junior Handlers awards will remain the same as in previous years.

Starter Guidelines (Updated). This has now been sent out as an appendix to the rulebook.

Secretary's correspondence. The BFA does not encourage regular advertising of goods for sale on the discussion board especially from trading companies. Anyone wishing to sell items should apply for a link to the website.

Show Organisers should, when purchasing new jumps, ensure that they are the correct height before using them in competitions.

Membership Secretary's Report. The membership stands at 1611 as of 28th October 2007. There are 174 Primary teams.

Show Secretary's Report. It was agreed that all running orders for shows should be posted on the discussion board in addition to being sent to team captains. They should show seed times used and declared times should be clearly marked.

The method for allocating places for over subscribed shows was confirmed. All entry form should be 'put in a hat' and all teams, on each form pulled out, will be allocated a place until entries are full.

Matters Arising since the last Meeting.

A BFA Judges and Ring Party seminar will hopefully be organised in April at Markfield.

(Updated) A few minor word changes to the Rules and Policies have now been issued.

It has been noticed that some dogs have been measured and recorded on the height form before they are 18 months of age. All Head Judges have been asked to check dogs' ages before their first measurement.

Date of the Next Meeting. 24th February 2008.

Happy memories of flyball – Smudge - retired but not finished.

On 17th July 1999 a pensive new handler and new dog came to their first flyball tournament at Nostell Priory near Wakefield. Their names, John Verity BFA number 0768 and his rescued Border Collie called Smudge, BFA number 0768A. Looking at the points table either we did not have many runs or we were slow but it was a start of a pairing that would continue racing for many years. At that time in the North of England flyball tournaments were unheard of apart from the country shows like the one at Nostell Priory and we had to travel a several hundred mile round trip into the uncharted territory of Newark, Daventry and Market Harborough to get some racing. The training days organised by Doreen Smith and her team and Alison Booth of the Wakefield Tykes gave us both the incentive and skills to progress and by January 2000, Smudge had gained enough points to be awarded a 'Flyball Dog' certificate.

At that time teams in the first division were slow compared to today's times and I can well remember the jubilation when the Wakefield Tykes came home with a time of under 20 seconds. I think it was 19.85 seconds but no doubt I will be corrected if I am wrong. Oh how things have changed.

During 2000 and 2001 new teams based in Yorkshire appeared on the circuit namely the Yorkshire Bouncers, under the very watchful eye of Betty Potts and Greetland Grasshoppers formed by Howard Campbell. During this period, Smudge and I were both gaining experience and confidence and were attending many tournaments, some now organised by the new clubs as well as the Wakefield Tykes.

In July 2000, Smudge had gained his Flyball Dog Intermediate and nearly 12 months later had accrued enough points to be presented with his Flyball Dog Graduate certificate.

Three years after his inaugural tournament, in March 2002 it was a very proud John Verity who was presented with Smudge's 5,000 points Flyball Dog Advanced certificate.

Smudge was one of those dogs that just got on and did the job and would run in any position in the team. Nothing fazed him, not even dogs running across to his lane, he took everything in his stride. His fastest single time at the peak of his career was 4.35 seconds

In June 2003 he got the prestigious Silver award for his Flyballing efforts. He was slowing down a bit now and was also involved on the Agility circuit but he still relished the idea that a good day out was Flyball or Agility.

During 2004 and 2005 he raced with the Ruff Runners and in May 2006 joined the Dog Friendly Flyball Team and ran as lead dog with the Dog Friendly Racers as well as racing with the Dog Friendly Sprinters when the need arose.

It took another 2 years for him to reach the Gold Award and now age was telling and when he went for his annual check-up with the vet in 2006 we were told that his eye sight was failing and cataracts were starting to form. We knew then that his flyballing days were numbered.

It would have been great for him to gain his Ice Blue Moon Award but this was not to be. He just failed to reach it by about 1500 points but after he crashed into the jumps at Doncaster in December 2007 the decision was made that the 2007 Christmas tournament at Sheffield would be his last sanctioned tournament run.

That last run in Division 5 at Sheffield was very emotional, but true to form, Smudge did not put a foot wrong and the team gained a third place in the Division.

However, on a good note, he will still be about at flyball tournaments and if anyone wants a steady reliable dog to trundle up and back in a Starter, Veteran or other fun event just ask for Smudge.

Hopefully Smudge will have a long and happy retirement and I have plenty of happy memories that will keep me happy as well.



Smudge and I did not achieve what we did on our own. Flyball is a team event and we have to thank several hundred people, too numerous to name, who are involved in the sport. They have helped us, laughed with us, raced with us, raced against us - sometimes winning, sometimes losing, but that did not matter. At the end of the day all that matters is that we did our best and we enjoyed what we did. Thank you everybody, Smudge and I have had a wonderful 8 years on the flyball circuit and hopefully I will continue on the flyball circuit for a few years yet with my other dogs Jake and Wisp.

The £2.00 fee for inclusion of Primary Teams on the 'List of Teams to receive Tournament Schedules' has been discontinued as these Schedules are now available from the Website. However existing information on currently active Teams and their contact points will be retained in this format.

Please remember to complete the section at the foot of the Form requiring continued agreement to abide by the Association's Current Rules & Policies and Code of Ethics, ensuring it is signed and dated. Failure to do so will result in the Form being returned for completion before your membership can be renewed.

Annual Fees remain at current year's levels:

The limitation on voting rights continues to apply to Joint memberships where they cover more than two members recorded as residing at the same address.

Charity begins ... but ...

Every one of us probably has at least one charity that we support in preference to all others, albeit most of these other good causes are probably equally deserving of our money and/or our time. One individual can only do so much, but a group or an association can sometimes do much more.

I, personally, have a lot of time for the Salvation Army and its good works with the homeless and destitute. The Air Ambulance, RNLI and Macmillan Cancer Support (to name but three) are charities that also help my fellow man. Simply by being a member of Sea Watch, the RSPB or one of the Wildlife Trusts, one can help make this planet a better place. But what, I hear you ask, of man's best friend? Whatever the preferences of individuals in a dog club, society, or association, I believe that a wholly dog oriented organisation (given a mandate from its members so to do) should solely support canine based charities.

The charity **Border Collie Rescue** has recently announced that it will have to close unless it can generate income of at least £500 per week to feed and house the dogs it takes in to treat mentally and/or physically and assess prior to re-homing to an appropriate environment. See www.bordercollierescue.org and, particularly, the YouTube clip of the staff and volunteers at work; *no-one is paid for what they do*. One of our team members, Jo, has stayed with Nicki and Mike who offer dog friendly B&B/overnight accommodation at the centre; Jo can vouch for the quality of life given to the dogs in BCR's care and the hard work that goes into their rehabilitation.

Given that possibly 80% plus of dogs taking part in flyball competitions are border collies or collie crosses (many of them rescued dogs now leading a fulfilling life), it seems to me that the BFA as an organisation and teams hosting flyball events are natural candidates for rallying support for a charity looking after this particular breed. Perhaps, with member approval, a lump sum could be given or a percentage of event 'profit' donated. It is, however, on-going financial commitment that is most desperately needed.

There are other very worthwhile collie/working sheepdog rescue charities such as the Border Collie Trust and Wiccaweys, but I put it to you that at this critical time for this particular canine charity, **Border Collie Rescue** is most deserving of our support not only as individuals but also at Club and Association level. Please lobby your BFA regional representative and, if you are on a club or event committee, put your suggestion for help on the agenda for serious consideration. (Many teams supported Wiccaweys during their particular crisis recently so perhaps BCR *is* now the organisation that most needs our help? Ed)

JOURNEY TO THE SUMMER CHAMPIONSHIPS TITLE 2007

LIVE WIRES became UK Flyball Champions in August 2007. Why hasn't this appeared before? Well... the intention was to send this in to appear in the November Flyball record some time ago, but you could say I have only just come down from the dizzy heights and still can hardly believe it happened at all!

Some teams may know us, some may not but just a little bit of history will help put you all in the picture. I am captain of the Live Wires team that was formed at the end of Millennium Year. The first I knew about flyball was when I spotted it on TV - Crufts Flyball at the NEC in Birmingham - it looked fun! At the time I already had three border collies, one was getting past it for competition work but the other two were keenly involved at our local obedience clubs, one of which held agility sessions on Saturday mornings. We took part with vigour and enthusiasm in this dog sport. With one of my dogs, Trixie we became part of a display team for a while, travelling round the country demonstrating obedience and agility routines. Trixie, brainy and good at everything she did, also took to working trials and was placed in her very first competition. This wetted my appetite and I decided I needed to get more involved in competitive agility so I joined another club, still in Cheshire but a little distance away, only to discover they ran not only agility but flyball as well. So in the early summer of 2000 my husband Geoff with Jodie aged three & I with Trixie, aged 4 joined in courses at the club for both agility & flyball.

Doreen Smith from Northern Bytes ran the flyball course and in no time, especially after competing for a Northern Bytes starters' team, we became hooked. The team was clocking up times in the low 19 seconds that we thought was brilliant, but the buzz and excitement was something else! Eventually we were encouraged to form our own team and I set up Live Wires at a local sports ground near Warrington, Cheshire. We used the name 'Wires' because Warrington was once known as one of the foremost producers of wire products internationally. The Warrington Rugby League team were then known as 'The Wires'. Times change, there is less industry in the town and the Rugby team is now known as 'Warrington Wolves' but we have at least revived its name. At first we wore the Warrington colours of yellow & blue but since then, initially sponsored by ProPlan we changed to black and finally to the colours we have now of red & black which was when we got our new sponsor Jolley's Super Stores. Now our teams are sponsored by CSJ Specialist Canine Feeds. They sponsor just two flyball teams in the UK, us in the North and Mad Mutts in the South**. Meantime we also moved our training venue to where we are now, Sutton Fields, Near Runcorn, Cheshire.

Five of us, who trained and raced with Northern Bytes initially, set up our new team and registered with the BFA at the end of 2000. All but one of the five still race their dogs with Live Wires even now. My mother bought us our first boomerang flyball box and we gathered together the equipment necessary to train regularly. Little did we know that from those small beginnings this would eventually lead to us achieving such success six years later.

In order to get going, at first we contacted local obedience clubs, vets practices and pet shops. Within a year we'd held several courses and in no time at all we had five times the number we started with. Since that first year we've never had to advertise. Trixie and Jodie were in our first Live Wires team which achieved a not very exciting time of 21.50 seconds the first competition they raced in, the year was 2001 – do you remember that earlier that year the Foot & Mouth epidemic hit the UK and disrupted some shows? Less than two years later (2003), with the team making good progress up the charts, unfortunately my dog Trixie died of an unknown ailment when she was at her peak, aged nearly six. The same year we lost two other Live Wires dogs and we'd only just really got started!

We always seem to bounce back and over six years we've grown more than I ever imagined and are now arguably the largest flyball club Nationwide. We've been unique because rather than comprising a few members with lots of dogs we have a large number of members that have just one or two dogs and have some forty plus members now. (I can confirm that the Live Wires has the biggest bundle of Flyball Records – they keep spilling out of their elastic bands! Ed). We continue to attract new members year in

year out and must have had hundreds of dogs and their owners attend courses we've run, but thank goodness they didn't all make the grade! We have had fall outs and people have left us in that time but largely speaking we are able to maintain a friendly atmosphere and we try to incorporate many other social functions along with the flyball itself. We've been running BFA Sanctioned shows for about five years now and at our last event at Sutton Fields we ran two rings, with sixty-one open teams and twenty starter's teams taking part and also ran singles and pairs fun events on both days, using our own sets of lights in both rings.

Over the years we've increased the number of open teams we have in competition and officially with seven teams (each with at least five dogs), we can most times comfortably enter six teams in shows all year round. Our top teams now use the flat fronted box. It is hard work to maintain a collective enthusiasm and achieve the results we've been aiming for, but this year everything has come together in a big way. Early on, at Easter, Live Wires were the first 'northern' team in the UK to go sub 18 sec. but it meant working extra hard with our top team to maintain our high ranking. We have been lucky that several teams from the North and North Wales have all gained times under 18 seconds since and so we have had top quality competition every time we competed. This kept the team at peak fitness throughout the 'summer'. We'd been doing well at local shows up North but the Summer Championships... is something again! I really hoped we'd not let ourselves down, but never in a million years did I think we had any chance of winning.

Looking at it logically we really shouldn't have won because there were teams there that probably should have beaten us to the title and other teams that didn't attend which were probably better than us. However on the day, though we lost our first race we won all the rest. The main thing was the team kept their cool and made few mistakes. Times weren't brilliant compared to the rest of the season but in the end *we did it* and we are proud to bring the trophy to the North for the first time. A pointer to all the new teams setting out - it just shows what can be done, it needn't be just a pipe dream, so get planning for your turn at being National Champions! It just could happen *one day*... as it did for us.

In August 2008 Live Wires have volunteered to organise the next and renamed event. 'The National Flyball Championships' which will be held at Holt Farm, Southam, Warks, not very far from Fords' Sports and Social Club, Daventry where it was held last year. It is being held over three days 15th-17th August and we (that's the BFA Committee & Live Wires) would like to see as many teams as possible attending, what we hope will be the largest flyball tournament in the **UK EVER**. It should be fantastic, lots going on, two rings, marquee for evening entertainment, 'cream teas' down the road and so on – **SO** get it booked in your diary and we'll see you there!

News from across the channel

It seems a very long time ago that we were celebrating our very enjoyable European Championships. As Wilfried (**Ball Amazonen**) commented 'Despite the weather it became such a memorable experience. **Making new friends was the essence of this tournament** – whether it was inside the ring racing them, outside commenting with them on the teams (and the judges...) inside, or trying to warm up over some German Apfeln... (As a participant myself I can vouch for Wilfried's remarks, it was great to meet such charming people. Ed)

It's interesting to note that our European friends appear to finish their flyballing for the winter, their last tournament having been the Belgian Championships indoors at the end of November. However, we had some exciting news that at the beginning of October the **Jolly Jumpers** broke the ten-year record held by **The Jets** (our very successful team that was formed in the early days of Flyball and included **Wayne** and **Alison O'Rourke** – now **Maple Leafs**.) The **Jolly Jumpers** achieved a time of 16.57 seconds, the finishing touch to a perfect season for them.

This year's European Championships are to be held in the Czech Republic at the beginning of July (4th, 5th & 6th) at (for those keen geographers!) Greyhound Racetrack Mlada Boleslav, roughly fifty miles North East of Prague. Of course pet passports would be needed by anyone from Britain who wanted to attend and this really needed advance planning. (I know some members were keen to go this year but... too late?) [Reading the message board a couple of members still seem keen to 'take the plunge' this year. Ed.] You (umm your dog) can't return to the UK for six months after the rabies blood test. First you need a rabies vaccine then two weeks later a blood test. It's advisable to have a second rabies vaccine as it's cheaper than having to re-do both vaccine and blood test if the first vaccine doesn't generate enough anti-bodies. You also need your dog micro chipped and it's worth doing research as the paperwork is complex. Also have your microchip checked just before you leave in case of any problems – no chip...no dog! That's the bad news – the good news is that you can make up your own teams and enter, so if you want to go in 2009 it's worth starting to think about it now, sorting out the costs etc. and finding like-minded flyballers to go adventuring. The decision for the following year's venue is usually taken in August.

[Apparently some of the 'continentals' feel that when the oldest Flyball nation in Europe (with over two hundred teams on the books - one hundred plus active during the 2007 European Championships) cannot put together one single scratch team, it 'borders' on boycott. '**The gauntlet has been thrown down**'!Ed]

Cassie came to us (her fifth owners) in December 2000, three weeks before her third birthday and died just two weeks after her tenth birthday. We had her for just seven precious years.

Everyone who was a BFA member back in 2001 would have read Cassie's story in the Flyball Record Issues February 2001, May 2001 and February 2002. She came to us as a hyperactive, noisy, confident, extrovert who wouldn't think twice about having a go at any dog who upset her. However, within five months Cassie was not only doing BFA Flyball in any team, in any position but ran in our winning Crufts team in 2001 & 2002. She became a hyperactive, vivacious and lovable girl who was happy to mix socially with both dogs and humans; anyone could run Cassie (as long as they could keep her feet on the ground).

Cassie achieved her Diamond Award (60,000 points) in October last year and seemed fit and well except that she had cataracts in both eyes. We were planning a Vet's visit to discuss a cataract operation but she developed an eating problem over Christmas so the visit to the Vets was for this instead. X-rays showed an obstruction and an exploratory laparotomy was performed. To our horror the Vet informed us that she had a large tumour in her bowel, which had spread to her lymph glands and the prognosis was very poor. Together, we had to make the very difficult decision to let Cassie go on the operating table.

It seems inconceivable that she is gone, she was doing Flyball only three days before that fateful operation, she was so full of life and we miss her terribly.
