LIVE WIRES AT 'THE DOUBLE'

What a great year 2012 turned out to be for Live Wires Flyball Teams! The year started fairly ignominiously, but during the summer months, picked up and gathered force. After reducing our own BFA record time, (**16.32 secs**) at our own show in May, **Live Wires** were thrilled to gain a further two titles.

From 2007 (when we first won the BFA Championships) we've certainly built on that, becoming BFA Champions twice (2011 & 2012) and 2^{nd} in 2008 & 2010. More recently, with High Flyers we also starred in **ITV's 'Red or Black'**.

Ahead of either competition this year, we didn't really have any expectations, but surprised ourselves and have realised since that *gaining both the European and British Championships titles in the same year is quite unique!* It was a fitting end to a hard fought campaign over a 4 week period during July & August! Despite the gloomy summer we stayed lucky, with the weather remaining fine for all our races.

Against strong opposition in both events, Wires were unbeaten. We felt very proud that *in the 14* years the European Championships have been held, we were the first team from the UK to win the *title*. Three of our other teams (Copper, Electrics & Connexion) also gained successes $(2^{nd} \& 3^{rd})$ over the two competitions.

Thanks to the organisers of both events (High Flyers/Alpha Dogz and the BFA Committee) for putting on hugely successful and enjoyable shows. Thanks too for the support from other BFA teams and our Sponsor, CSJ.

As the number of Scottish teams has increased we held our first seminar in Perth to enable members to ring party and judge to a good standard, our thanks go to Lomond Raiders for their hard work sourcing the venue and hospitality.

More recently we have had a useful conference with Qualified and Head Judges to clarify rules and interpretations. Some rules will be 'tweaked' to cover these clarifications in the January rule changes however it seems that the work that has been done on the rule book has been generally successful. Of course there will always be queries that need to be addressed from time to time.

CHAIRPERSON'S SLOT

As another year ambles towards its end, it's a time for reflection on the past twelve months in BFA flyball. I am sure that none of us could ever have imagined the mixture of emotions that were experienced within the sport.

The year started, for many, with excitement and anticipation as teams introduced their novice dogs, new members and team line ups. Winter training sessions, in rain, wind and even snow, are all worth it when we see the novice dog complete its first clean run or the new member get their "flyballers eye" and achieve good passes. The first divisional placing for a new team line-up is always special... and often a relief!!

The weather caused much frustration but great flyball achievements were still gained.

Extreme Racers broke the British record with the amazing time of 16.06, becoming not only the fastest team in the UK but also in Europe. The sub 16 second time was now so close and the excitement generated each time they raced, was palpable for all who watched.

The European Championships at Littleport show cased European flyball at its best, with strong competition from many other European countries, where flyball is growing rapidly. The opening ceremony was attended by teams from Belgium, Germany, Poland, and Austria alongside the UK, where flags were waved and cheers raised as each team were introduced. The racing was close throughout the three days, with the divisional finals providing tremendous excitement All the BFA teams performed extremely well, with many teams winning speed trials, achieving divisional wins and placings, making it onto the winners podium. Live Wires became the first UK team to win the European Championships beating the reigning champions, Jolly Jumpers from Belgium in the final. I am sure you will agree, a fantastic achievement for all the team. The EFC 2012 was filmed and shown early September, great to see many familiar faces both human and canine on the TV!!!

With many tournaments cancelled due to the weather, the National Championships were also under threat, and the committee had many nervous hours looking at weather forecasts. To be fair, the weather gave us a battle as the deluge of rain continued for over one day during the setting up period. Once you have reached the point of total saturation, replacing your clothing, waiting until the rain subsides or holding an umbrella becomes pointless, so we continued to squelch our way through. Many of you arrived on Thursday, welcomed by rain and helpers in luminous jackets, however in true flyballing spirit, tents were pitched, caravans parked, team flags erected, followed very quickly by conversation and laughter as members got together. Arbury stood up to the weather well, and soon the Championships were under way. Again, teams performed exceptionally well, some achieving personal best times, divisional wins and placings. It is the place where we all congregate, meeting with those we see rarely and to celebrate our sport...we have some great flyball dancers out there!!!

This is the biggest event on the BFA calendar and over the years, has been the place where many members have experienced great times and memories are made. It was therefore the best platform for us to say goodbye to one of our much loved and respected flyball family members, Pam Harrison of Nuneaten Flyers. The sea of colour as we all stood in our flyball kits, listening to Pam's friends and family as they shared their memories of her, was a sight to behold and one which I am sure Pam would have loved (even those of us who had come straight from the racing lanes and were mud splattered!!) She touched the lives of so many and her love, knowledge, wisdom and great sense of humour will be so very much missed by her family, the Nunnies and the BFA. I am sure she would be one of the first to congratulate the Live Wires as they held the Championship trophy for the second year in succession.

The committee continues to serve the membership and is looking forward to the changes ahead as we lead the association forward. The website has now been relocated to a new server in preparation to enable online payment of fees, starting with membership renewal this year. The development of a new website will be done in stages over the next year or so. We would like to thank Nigel Bouckley for all his efforts over the years as BFA webmaster. The laser system measuring devices are currently being purchased with the aim of implementing these over the coming months. The regional representative programme is in its early stages but progress is steadily being made. The lights working party continue to investigate development of EJS for the future. Thank you to all those who serve on the committee or as BFA officers for your continued efforts, they are very much appreciated. I would ask that we all are courteous and respectful when communicating with BFA officials and that you contact the correct person via the correct channel. Please do not send BFA enquiries to the committee via their Facebook accounts as these may be missed.

The committee recently hosted a judging and ring party seminar in Perth, Scotland. This is the first time a seminar has been held in Scotland, and it was felt that as the sport continues to grow in this region of the UK, the BFA needs to actively support its members in their quest to ensure competent judging and ring parties. We received such a warm welcome and we all learnt so much from each other. It was great to see the enthusiasm for our sport and the drive to really develop flyball in Scotland. Meeting up with those members we knew and those who have only just begun playing flyball resulted in many flyball related conversations! The future of flyball north of the border is in safe hands

So what will next year bring? There are those events that we expect and those that will be unexpected but each one will bring new experiences. How we respond to those experiences is important, whether we win or lose, has to be done in a sporting manner. A respected long time member of the BFA recently commented to me that teams applauding each other after the race has finished, is now the exception rather than the rule. Our sport has always been known for its sportsmanship and friendships; we have to ensure this continues. Fast times, divisional wins and flyball awards pale into insignificance if they are achieved in a sport that has lost sight of its origins - having fun with your dog. Healthy rivalry, strong competition makes for great racing but it's only great if there is mutual respect and enjoyment for all involved. UK flyball is flourishing and we are achieving great things. If we can continue to do this whilst embracing the spirit of flyball that is an achievement we can all be proud of.

The growth of seed lists

The first time I edited the Flyball Record unaided was the November issue 2004 and as I haven't been able to include the seed lists in this issue, I did a bit of delving. It's either interesting or yawn making!

In 2004 there were 138 seeded teams on the list of which 108 were seeded less than 22 seconds. That's 78.2% of the teams. Just one team was seeded at over 30 seconds. 7 teams (5%) were running under 18 seconds.

Take ourselves eight years on and we have 500 seeded teams on the list of which 408 are seeded less than 22 seconds. That's 81.6% of the teams. There are currently no teams seeded at over 30 seconds. 52 teams (10.4%) are currently seeded less than 18 seconds. (Ed.)

The growth of Flyball in Scotland

I had a taster of Scottish Flyball in 2006 when a few PODs entered a team into the shows run by Clatto Clangers and Tayside Roadrunners respectively. The shows were small, very friendly and really enjoyable.

Frank and I moved to Aberdeen the following year for work reasons, started Granite City Gems Flyball team and we have seen Flyball grow significantly in the last few years. In the 'early days' there was one weekend of Flyball a year in Scotland....yes A YEAR! Currently there are nine BFA registered teams regularly training and competing in Scotland. The number of Scottish shows has increased dramatically with Lomond Raiders running a set of successful indoor and outdoor one day tournaments, Dundee Dynamutz and Tayside Roadrunners running shows in the summer and my own team, Granite City hosting two one day open shows, and a one day multibreed tournament this year.

The shows are still small, very friendly and always enjoyable but there are some challenges.

Tournaments usually have a relatively small entry resulting in a large spread of team times in each division. Tournament organisers are usually setting up for a two division day – which involves as much work as for a larger show but without the income. The generally small number of entries (typically two divisions per show) can make it very tight to make a show financially viable. Our aim is to break even and for some shows that was a real challenge this year with the cost of venues, prizes, hire of BFA lights etc. As Flyball grows further in Scotland and more teams form and more shows are run, the sport gains momentum. More people are interested in judging and becoming qualified and with Alison Moyes as a Head Judge we can run our local shows more readily. Teams who travel more have been instrumental in delivering lights to shows (thanks to Dundee Dynamutz and Lomond again).

In early October the BFA Committee and Lomond team worked together to deliver a wonderful weekend of learning to our Scottish team members and with this support Flyball will continue to grow and improve. The best thing about Scottish Flyball (imho) is the friendly rivalry, great atmosphere at shows and co-operation between teams to get the shows underway. Long may it continue!

Question Time

Why?

> Do we have incident report forms – nothing happens when you send them in!

This is a typical reply when it is suggested to members who are rightly concerned about things like dog behaviour, handler's behaviour towards dogs, member's behaviour towards other members etc.

You feel aggrieved but you don't feel the incident warrants a £50.00 full on complaint.

It may well surprise you to find that the piece of paper you've carefully penned hasn't been scrunched up and used as target practice for lobbing a ball into the ball bucket rather than actually taking the ball to the bucket. Ball shaggers (dodging the wayward ball) will be aware that no such practice takes place!

What really happens

Our lovely Secretary receives the form and takes note of the incident. This may well be referred to the rest of the Committee for discussion of possible action before it is carefully filed away for future reference. This helps the Committee to build a 'picture' should we find we have a 'serial' offender. Our rules allow the Committee to prefer charges within 6 months of an alleged incident/s.

The Committee is currently looking to build up a database that will save time and similar offences (ie harsh handling) will be logged together alongside the member's essential details.

> Do we need to send advance results to the Treasurer with our racing fees?

This just gives us extra work and uses more paper that will as above just be scrunched up and used for target practice.

What really happens

The racing fees envelope drops onto the treasurer's door mat and she eagerly opens it only to groan in dismay when she finds that the advance results form has not been included. Now she will have to wait until stats have uploaded the results onto the website before she knows that the correct amount has been sent. It only takes a maximum of 2 minutes to check from the advance results form, but an email will need to be sent to the TO asking for the advance results and a reply awaited. Your treasurer is loath to impose the £25.00 fine for late arrival – it's not just the money that has to be sent within 7 days!!

TO's may, if they wish, send the advance results to the treasurer by email at the same time as they send them to the Show Secretary. Just copy to valcstitchers@gmail.com

> Does it take a long time for the Championships cheques to be submitted to the bank?

What really happens

You send your entries and camping fees to the BFA Secretary and as usual for a TO, the cheques will not be submitted until after the event has taken place. For a 'normal' tournament, the TO can then go to their bank. Following the Championships, the Secretary has to pass the cheques on to the treasurer by hand (for security purposes) at the next tournament both of them are attending. The treasurer then has to process the cheques which can take several days in between other essential activities. Every cheque is logged onto the paying in slip with details of the cheque number and the team/member paying it.

Sometimes illness or accidents can prevent the treasurer from actually getting to the bank as soon as she would like. Sooo... please check your bank account rather than assume the cheque has been submitted.

If any other matters of a similar nature irk you, please feel free to send them in and we will try to answer them. It's much better to get the correct answer 'from the horse's mouth'!

He was a very small Patterdale terrier puppy only a very few weeks old just left in a supermarket carrier bag, probably overnight, cold frightened and bewildered. We think that he was probably either an unwanted Christmas present or perhaps the one remaining unsold pup of a litter. He was brought home, warmed, cleaned up and reported to our local council dog warden. After a home visit and microchip check we were 'allowed' to keep him.

The little lad was rapidly christened Chip as he had a fleck of white on one paw and of course he was welcomed into our small pack of then two Flyball mad Border Collies.

We had never considered homing a small Terrier so we were slightly alarmed to read about the reputation of some working Terriers. Patterdale's are born to hunt apparently and were reportedly very different to our experience of our BC's particularly with regards to obedience and temperament. Chip with his docked tail was clearly of the working type rather than lapdog variety of terrier.

Temperament wise how wrong could we have been! Chip has 'grown' into a very obedient and pleasant little lad who has a terrific recall. Extremely friendly he is a great pleasure to have in our small (but ever expanding) dog pack and family.

Obviously as we were already competing in Flyball with our other dogs, little Chip was introduced early to the sport and trained once old enough to do so safely but without any expectation that he would be any good at the sport. How people must have smiled when our youngest daughter Lydia turned up shortly after he was 18 months old to race in his very first race. A small girl with a tiny scruffy dog, so small the jumps were set at the lowest 7" height. But not as surprised as when he actually raced!

If you have ever seen little Chip race it is quite extraordinary, Chip has turned into a far from the run of the mill very small height dog. So far he has a fastest recorded time of 4.5 seconds for a single leg mainly achieved because of his terrific box turn and a very low jump height over the jumps. But not only can he pull off the odd quick time, Chip regularly runs 4.7 second legs at the very start of the racing day but then will still be running them at the very end of the day as well, such is his remarkable stamina.

In 2012 Chip has really excelled himself being part of a Flyball team which won their divisions both in the European and British Championships. In Multibreed racing his team also won their division this year with a club record time of 17.41 seconds.

In September Chip was awarded his 25,000 point BFA Platinum Award being only the second Patterdale Terrier to ever earn this milestone award. This was then topped shortly afterwards when he became the all-time highest point earning Patterdale Terrier in BFA history.

And how old is this veteran of Flyball? Chip will only actually be 5 years old in November 2012 so hopefully he has a few more years Flyball left in him yet! Congratulations to little Chip and our daughter Lydia and it just goes to show how an unwanted pup can really shine given half a chance.

So if you do see Chip out and about at a Flyball tournament anytime please do come over and say hello and make a big fuss of him.
