The committee are all talk and no action :

The uphill downhill struggle has been re-

solved, it is now in the guidelines that where there is an obvious slope, we run uphill to the box. Through a show of hands at the AGM, a majority of the membership saw the rules of physics win the day. There are many more safety problems in-between the run back and the box, divets, debris, adverse conditions etc....and we have set up a safety sub committee to look at these problems, excessive ambient temperatures is one such subject and the rules have been changed to allow the Head Judge to delay, postpone or shorten races in such conditions. We were glad to see these new rules and common sense being used at Knebworth.

If it is an individual's responsibility to make sure that their dog is ringed when they run, do they not have to shoulder some responsibility to handle and treat their dogs correctly in adverse conditions as well ?. The way forward in this is through education and training, and to this end we will be issuing guide lines and emergency procedures to help in this event. (See page 2 of this publication).

The Flyball Record is improving all the time, and was not paid for by the BFA initially as we could not at the time issue cheques, every effort was made to get it to you as soon as was possible. A big thank you to Steph for all of her efforts.

A Show Organiser's Guide is being rewritten, and will be freely available to everyone. This will go along way to help new Organisers to put on a show at the same high level as we are accustomed to.

#### The Flyball News

#### K.C. Licensed events :

The committee looked to the future on this one, the future of Flyball, new members, new competition and new sponsorship. Being in the public eye will bring all of this, the past is very unfortunate, but it is the past. With no official objections coming from the K.C., an unofficial investigation took place, the way forward is not to rock their boat and they wont rock ours. Our members will not be liable under rule 42 whilst the situation is ongoing, and at present there is no need for further negotiations. Because of the past, Flyball could lose shows like the Middlesex Show, Daventry and probably many, many more. Where would this end up, hiding away from the public, no County or Country Shows. Where would sponsorship come from, no one would see their product. When a show is sanctioned a written pledge will be given by the organiser to distance the Flyball ring as far as is practical from other doggy events, so to avoid rocking anybody's boat. The Middlesex Show has run for years with no problems, Flyball being far removed from other doggy events, and long may this continue.

The E.G.M. will be on 19th September 1999, at Southmoore Village Hall, near Abingdon in Oxfordshire. It will start at 10.00 am, more details to follow.

#### Recent e-mails :

We are trying to implement an asset register, we as a committee do not know what assets the BFA have, nor do we know where they are. If you can offer any information about this matter please contact Robert Henshall the BFA Treasurer. robert.henshall@lineone.net. No cash membership renewals will be accepted at shows in the future, and if you want a receipt then a self addressed envelope is required. Paying by cheque will give you a receipt on your statement.

There is a need to communicate with outside bodies such as NAFA, Flyball Association's from Belgium, Australia etc....this should be through official channels. If you wish to contact such bodies officially this should be done through the Committee, and your first point of contact should be the Chairman Roy Hiscock. This does not mean that you cannot contact your friends in these organisations, but any quotes should be through official channels.

NAFA Dog measuring rule (g) (i), says that it is at a **team's discretion** to have a height dog measured prior to competition. Then that a Head Judge can measure a dog at **any time**. Then if a dog is not measurable it **will jump 16** ". If it is not there to be measured, is it not measurable ?. How far away are we from NAFA rules on this. Open to interpretation !!!!!!!!

Heat stroke usually has reason, a history of an animal being confined in a over heated area or having undergone considerable exercise in hot or humid weather. The animal is usually distressed, panting, salivating, restless and unsteady on its feet. In severe cases the animal may be collapsed and may develop bluish / purple mucous membranes. The whole body will feel hot.

First the animal must undergo a body cooling treatment as soon as possible, and if possible the body temperature monitored. Cooling can be achieved by, wrapping in blankets soaked in cold water, or gently dousing water over the body. Be careful not to reduce too drastically, this may result in shock. Seek vetenary advise as soon as possible.

Also it is apparent that some dogs are becoming "Hyperthermic", this means that they cannot regulate their own body temperature. The only way to attempt to regulate this is by the amount of exercise given. It does not seem to be dependent of the weather or temperature but on the amount of exercise undertaken by the dog itself. It can happen a lot quicker in competition with another dog, i.e. running after a ball or Frisbee. So be warned, take care of your animals, watch them closely especially when competing, their safety is more important than a rosette or points or both. Any official complaints to the BFA will be taken very seriously indeed, so follow these guidelines:

Allow the drinking of water little but often (almost sipping to avoid bloating), keep in cool shaded area whenever possible, do not over exercise your dog (withdraw from competition if necessary, before you are asked to withdraw by the Head Judge), water down to reduce body temperature. Keep all four paws on the ground ( do not pull by the collar). May we point out that our B.F.A. rule 3.2 states that "Misconduct shall include but not be limited to ......wilful intent to gain unfair advantage or any behaviour that would leave a spectator, competitor, host or sponsor with an unfavourable opinion of 'Flyball'.".

Some if not many of the recent e-mails via this media could well be found in violation of this rule. Under rule 3.1 any member may place a £25.00 complaint against originators of such e-mails. So please refrain from this method of discussion and use the appropriate method i.e. the committee feed back page on the BFA web site or write to the Secretary.

#### Knebworth rumblings:

An investigation into alleged events at Knebworth, found that allegations against the Organiser and Committee to be unfounded. This appears to be largely blown up out of proportion, and no official complaints were made at the event to either the Committee members present, nor the Show Organisers.

We will continue to take every step possible to improve dog and handler safety, within reason. The Safety Sub Committee is constantly monitoring this situation. There will be an Accident/Incident form at every sanctioned Tournament, to enable us to record our safety record.

Dog measuring : Forgive the pun but this is also a heated situation, no height dog will be made run over 16 inches, Head Judges measure to stop interference during racing, so if requested and not measured it will run at the next height dogs height, that was measured, or the handler and / or team may elect to run not for competition. An investigation into this situation showed that the official BFA height form C9 has not been recorded and returned as desired. This will be addressed.As from Sunday 3rd October 1999, a recording system will be in place to allow a dog handler to apply for a height card, having been measured on three separate occasions, and agreed by at least two Head Judges on each occasion. This is optional, so if you want to gamble on your border line height dog, you may do so. The problem is that we want all Head Judges measuring with the same equipment, following the same procedures. To this end a Judges Seminar is to be held at Petersfield on 3rd October 1999 to ensure this happens, there will be more if you can not make it, and it is open to prospective Judges as well. So that in the future dog's can be measured

in a uniform way. Judges not attending this seminar will not be able to measure height dog's, but will be able to Judge a Sanctioned Tournament. All Head Judges must attend one of these seminars every three years to requalify. Only BFA approved measuring instruments and processs of measuring will be used from this date. This is intended to facilitate improved Judging, and a more accurate method of measuring, not victimise anyone.

In the happenings of recent, there is one shining light, many thanks to Nigel Bouckley who has been helpful, co-operative and a pleasure to work with, coming up with some innovative ideas.

But to conclude on a positive note, looking to the future, the possibility of pet Passports increases. With it the chance of competing in Europe in a true European Championship, members of the present and past Committees were there at the first, and competition is strong. Who knows maybe one day there will be a Flyball World Championship. We need to be ready when it does happen.

I am sure that you will join with me in hoping Carol Plumbley well in her convalescence on the road to good health, she has resigned from her post as Membership Secretary and in the best interests of her health the Committee has sadly accepted. Lorraine Fulford will be filling her position . The current BFA membership form is under review, to put all information on one side, thus easier and cheaper to produce.

#### A few observations:

Keep all four paws on the ground, do not haul your dog about by its collar, this may result in a complaint against your handling, and you will be asked to leave the ring by the Head Judge.

The only people allowed in the ring as a team at the time of racing, are the handlers, plus two runners, and a box loader. Any more may result in a complaint.

The throwing of objects in the run back area is not allowed in our rules.

Most important though, enjoy your Flyball and have a good time. That is what it is all about, isn,t it.
